

Phase Seven Victories - Amazing Ripple Effects

1. SAFE distributes Direct Client Assistance funds to partners across the state who serve 240 victims/survivors with things like food, hygiene items, clothing, bus passes, and car seats for their kids.



2. DCA recipients get more than assistance, they get dignity, independence, empowerment, and motivation to keep striving forward on their path to safety and stability.

Client Empowerment

- 3. After basic needs are met, survivors can pursue their goals like mental health, employment, and housing leading to financial stability and long-term flourishing.
- 1. SAFE subscribes to two grant databases and hires topnotch fundraising consultants to help all 17 partners raise more outside funding.

 Capacity Building

1. Before now, there was no shortterm housing available for trafficking victims in the South Sound, so partners paid \$150/night for hotel rooms to get victims out of the life.



2. IHTC partners with the Salvation Army in Olympia and SAFE funds two beds for trafficking victims in their safe, secure, 24/7 shelter.

2. One SAFE partner raises 4x their normal amount in a year-end campaign after following the consultant's guidance.

Short-Term Housing

4. IHTC and partners provide 400+ nights of safety to 27 victims, plus advocacy, case management, housing, counseling/treatment, education, employment, social services, etc. 3. IHTC ensures law enforcement knows there is finally housing available when they confront human trafficking, and invites other service providers to wrap around the victims as well.

2021 - Scarlet Road works with Kitsap County Sheriff's office to develop a SAFE funded screening tool to identify trafficking victims in the jails – so victims can get help while on the inside and re-entry services upon release.



2022 - Washington state asks Scarlet Road to use their screening tool in the two state women's prisons, and SAFE helps them implement in 2023.

2023 - Scarlet Road gets invited to share their screening tool at the state conference for juvenile detention leaders.

Victim Identification

2023 - 92 incarcerated or just released trafficking survivors are identified and receive services and care because of this program. 2023 - Scarlet Road adapts the tool for juvenile detention, and they now screen every youth that enters and serve those who have been exploited.
